- if a weight category has only one bronze medal (Nordic System):
 - (Australian National Championships) 4th place = 12 points
 - (Australia Cup) 4th place = 9 points
 - (Oceania Selection Event) 4th place = 9 points
 - (State Championships) 4th place = 9 points

- if we have only one 5th place in a weight category:
 - (Australian National Championships) 6th place = 9 points
 - (Australia Cup) 6th place = 7 points
 - (Oceania Selection Event) 6th place = 7 points
 - (State Championships) 6th place = 7 points

The number of matches will also determine additional points:

- 0 matches = 0 points
- 1 match = 4 points
- 2 matches = 6 points
- 3 matches = 8 points
- 4 or more matches = 10 points

How the ranking will be managed:

- In order to have a yearly ranking, we will count the points of the whole financial year (1 July - 30 June)
- At the end of financial year (June 30), the ranking will determine the best Athletes.
- The 1st of July, we will remove all the points and start all over again.
- The best Athletes of the previous financial year will be prioritised when choosing who to fund.
- If two or more athletes will have same amount of points WAI will look at:
 - Most wins by fall and/or tech fall
 - Least points given to the opponent
 - Least cautions against himself/herself
- In choosing who to fund WAI will be looking at additional information:
 - Past international performance since 2016
 - Date, event name, opponent name
 - Points won, points lost and outcome
 - Video or youtube link if available
 - **Videos are compulsory from beginning 2019**
 - Omissions and inaccuracies will not be looked upon favourably

- If there are less than 6 wrestlers in a weight category, the Nordic round will take place (each wrestler against each wrestler)
 - If there are 6 or 7 athletes in a weight category, a two pools system will be used
 - The awarded points go to the athlete in the category in which he/she competed, if the athlete changes the weight class the points will not be carried over
- We start off with Australia Cup because its been in our calendar for many years.
 - Oceania Selection Event is already scheduled in Sydney.
 - We use WA state championships event, because they have the biggest number of members.
 - To ensure fairness all events in the Point System will be rotated between states from year to year.
 - The reason I used financial year instead of calendar year is because World Championships for Cadets/Juniors/Seniors take place in the second part of the calendar year (July onwards)
 - Please pencil in following important dates and events for 2019 - 2020 financial year. Competitions outlined in red colour are not in the Point System:
 - Australia Cup: 14 July 2019, Melbourne
 - 2020 Oceania Selection Event: 3 November 2019, Sydney
 - 2019 WWA State Championships: 1 December 2019, Perth
 - 2020 Oceania Championships: 31 January 2020, Guam
 - 2020 Continental Qualification Tournament: 13 March 2020, Morocco
 - 2020 Senior National Championships: 17 May 2020, TBA
 - 2020 Challenge Event: 31 May 2020, Sydney
 - Only the National Championships will be closed event, the rest will be open to all wrestlers.
 - If non Australian Citizen places first at any ranking events, then we go down until we find first **two** Australian athletes who will wrestle off between themselves at the same event to determine who gets the highest points, the rest Australian athletes will just move up accordingly without any additional matches.
 - The World Championships 2019:

 - August 12 - 18 Tallinn, EST Juniors
 - September 14 - 22 Astana, KAZ Seniors
 - October 28 - 03 Budapest, HUN U23
