Select a Competition Director. Ensure they know their role and responsibilities as listed in the competition guidelines		
1. Competition Director		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure the other positions on the competition committee are filled by suitably qualified people and ensure all committee members are aware of their roles and responsibilities 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Obtain a copy of the latest UWW and WA Ltd. rules and policies, distribute them to the other committee members and ensure the event conforms to them 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Liaise with the WA Ltd. regarding endorsement and other issues 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete application for WA Ltd. endorsement form and return to National Office prior to event 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complete and send this form to National Office 14 days prior to the event 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure all members attending follow the code of ethics 		
2. Weigh Master – their tasks		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Set up weigh in process in liaison with other committee members 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organise and train staff needed for weigh in 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organise for Doctor to be present for weigh in (optional) 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrange necessary equipment for weigh in 		



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Supervise weigh in procedure and manage any disputes 		
3. Pairing Master – their tasks		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Set up pairing process in liaison with other committee members 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organise trained staff to pair athletes at event 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Nominate Co-ordinator for Special Matches 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure all bout lists are available prior to event 		
5. Head official- their tasks		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Organise the train officials for tasks- runners, timers, scorers, announcers, registration officials 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure equipment is in place and available 		
6. Head Referee		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrange a roster of qualified referees for the competition 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide them with up to date copies of the UWW and WA Ltd rules and policies 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure the referees are aware of their roles and responsibilities 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Conduct a Referee Briefing 		
7. Event Safety Co-ordinator		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Conduct Safety Audit prior to event 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrange for First Aid/ Medical personnel 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrange first aid supplies – ice, first aid kit, stretcher etc 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrange for Blood spill equipment to be available 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure all competitors have completed waivers ,return completed waivers to WA Ltd National Office 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure incident report forms are completed and returned to WA Ltd National Office 		
8. Member Protection Officer		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Arrange for a trained Member Protection Officer to be at the event 		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure that the event complies with the WA Ltd Member Protection Policy
